

# COVID-19 Funding Update

## COVID-19 Relief Recreational Trails Program

The Iowa Transportation Commission approved a one-time, \$5 million allocation of funding to partially offset COVID-19 related reductions in the State Recreational Trails (SRT) program. The activities eligible for funding under this program can go towards property acquisition; construction of new trails; maintenance, resurfacing, and restoration of existing recreational trails; development and rehabilitation of trailside and trailhead facilities; and, trail linkages.

Applicants may be federal or state agencies or a local government. A non-eligible project sponsor (such as a non-profit organization) may partner with an eligible co-sponsor in applying for funds if the eligible sponsor will administer the project.

## Iowa Road Use Tax Fund: COVID-19 Impacts

Overall, COVID-19 impacts to the Road Use Tax Fund have been significantly less than originally feared. The estimated impact through June 2021 is a decrease of \$50 million. On March 9, 2021, the Iowa Transportation Commission approved the COVID-19 Relief Fund allocation for the distribution of the funds appropriated in the December 2020 Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act of 2021 (CRRSAA). The allocation plan is: Trails \$5.0 million, Highway IDOT 47.5% (\$55.5 million), County Secondary Road Fund 24.5% (\$28.6 million), Farm-to-Market Fund 8.0 % (\$9.4 million), and City Street Fund 20.0% (\$23.4 million) for a total of \$121.9 million. The State and Local Coronavirus Fiscal Recovery Funds legislation, part of the American Rescue Plan Act, was signed into law on March 11. The bill includes \$65.1 billion in direct, flexible aid to every county, city, town, or village in the United States.
